

# esson plan: HRT Supply Crisis

#### Overview

This 30-40 minute B2-C1 lesson is on the topic of hormone replacement therapy (HRT). The lesson has a pre-reading vocabulary activity followed by a short text where students read for specific information, and a discussion activity to finish.

# Part 1: vocabulary

Have students work in pairs to complete the definitions with the words.

Go through the answers as a class. Deal with any vocabulary queries.

### Part 2: reading

A. Have students work individually or in pairs to read the text and answer the questions. Click the link to access the article.

Go through the answers as a class.

### Part 3: speaking
